WELCOME MESSAGE BY DANTE BRANDI, AMBASSADOR OF ITALY IN SINGAPORE AND BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

It is with great satisfaction that I welcome the Italian participation at ITMA ASIA + CITME 2025, which this year returns to Singapore from October 28 to 31, after several editions held in Shanghai. The decision to host the event once again in this important Asian hub highlights Singapore's central role in the global technological and industrial landscape.

The fair takes place in a year that is particularly significant for us: 2025 marks the 60th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Italy and Singapore, an occasion that celebrates a long history of cooperation and friendship between our two countries, based on shared values and complementary visions in the fields of technology, innovation, and sustainability.

The Italian participation, coordinated by ACIMIT in collaboration with ITA, includes over 100 companies, of which 52 are grouped under the National Sector Group and 48 participate independently. This number confirms the strength, vitality, and relevance of the Italian textile machinery sector, a global reference point for quality, innovation, and reliability.

In 2024, Italian textile machinery production reached 2.1 billion euros, with over 1.8 billion euros destined for export. Italy today exports textile machinery to around 130 countries, with a strong presence in Asia, which accounts for 41% of total sector exports, followed by the EU (20%), non-EU Europe (14%), and North America (10%).

Despite a complex global context marked by geopolitical uncertainties and logistical challenges, the Italian sector continues to stand out thanks to its ability to combine tradition and innovation, with particular attention to environmental sustainability, digitalization, and energy efficiency.

The 2025 edition of ITMA ASIA + CITME 2025 represents a strategic opportunity for our companies to strengthen dialogue with Asian markets, consolidate commercial relationships, develop new collaborations, and reaffirm Italy's role as a leading technological partner in the textile sector.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to ACIMIT for its outstanding coordination of the Italian companies, and to ITA for its continued efforts in promoting and supporting Italy's presence at this important event.

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ACIMIT - Association of Italian Textile Machinery Manufacturers, represents an industrial sector that comprises roughly 300 manufacturers (employing around 12,500 people), which produce machinery for an overall worth of around 2.1 billion euro, of which 86% are exported in about 130 Countries, mainly in Asia and Europe. Creativity, sustainable technology, reliability and quality are the hallmarks that have made Italian textile machinery worldwide leaders and the technological level of its production is considered of the highest standard by the competitors themselves.

Italian textile machinery manufacturers meet the full spectrum of industry needs (spinning, weaving, knitting, dyeing, finishing, printing and laundry machines). A lot of them produce machines for technical and innovative textiles too, maximizing the flexibility and versatility that characterize Italian supply.

Italian textile machinery industry: figures

In Italy there are approximately **300 companies** producing textile machines and related accessories, employing over **12,500 workers**.

The value of Italian production is about **2.1 billion euro**.

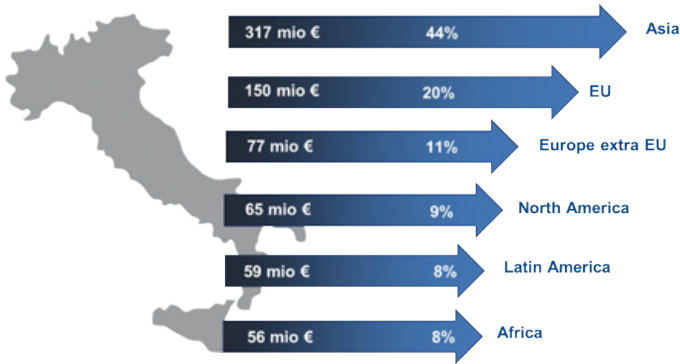

Italian textile machinery exports

86% of Italian total sales are realized in about 130 destination Countries. The process of internationalization and the vocation for innovation in the sector allowed Italian companies to strengthen the leading position of Italy in the world textile machinery industry.

% on total

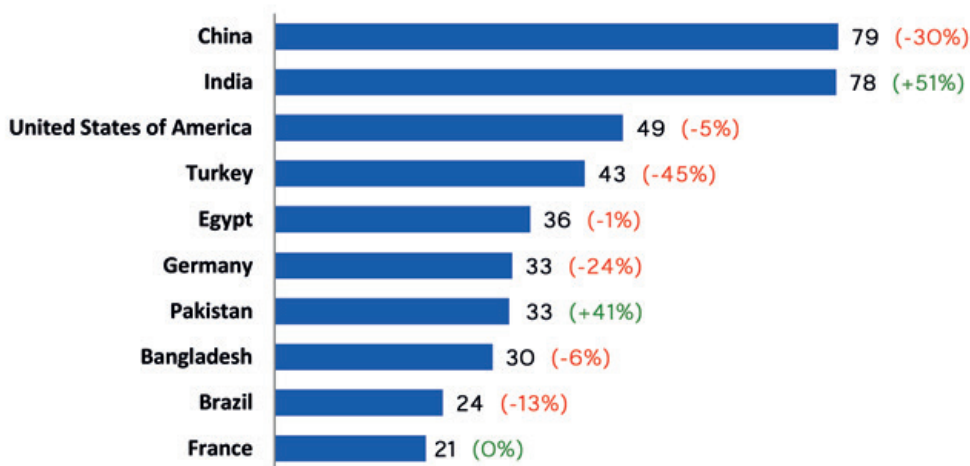

In the first half of 2025 the main destination of Italian exports of textile machines was **Asia** (44%), followed by **European Union** (20%) and **Europe extra EU** (11%). The biggest contribution to the Italian exports of textile machinery came from **China**. Italian sales toward Chinese market amounted to a value of 79 million euro. Others main markets are **India**, **United States of America** and **Turkey**.

million euro, y/y change

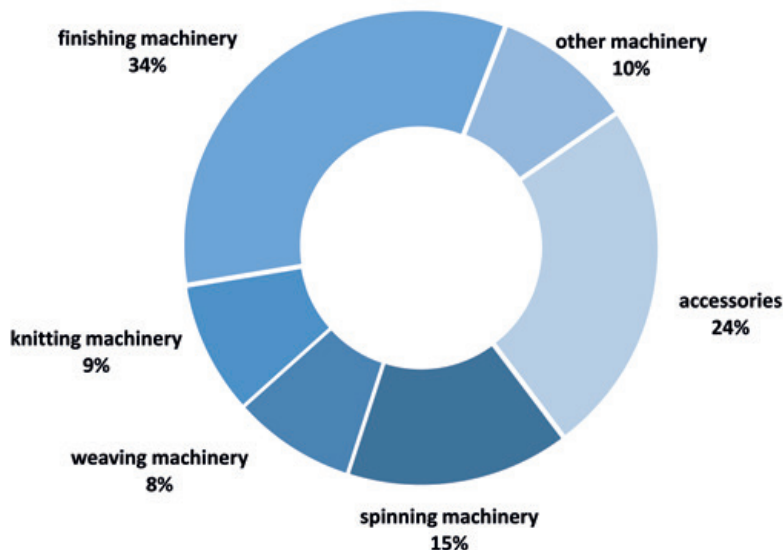

Reasons for a world success

Italian companies involved in the sector are small-size companies, deeply committed to R&D activities, looking for close cooperation with customers to create new opportunities and suitable solutions.

The ability to understand the needs of potential customers enables Italian companies to turn them quickly into dedicated machinery and devices which give rise to new high value-added market niches (such as the technical textiles) in the world textile market, both as regards economical and technological aspects.

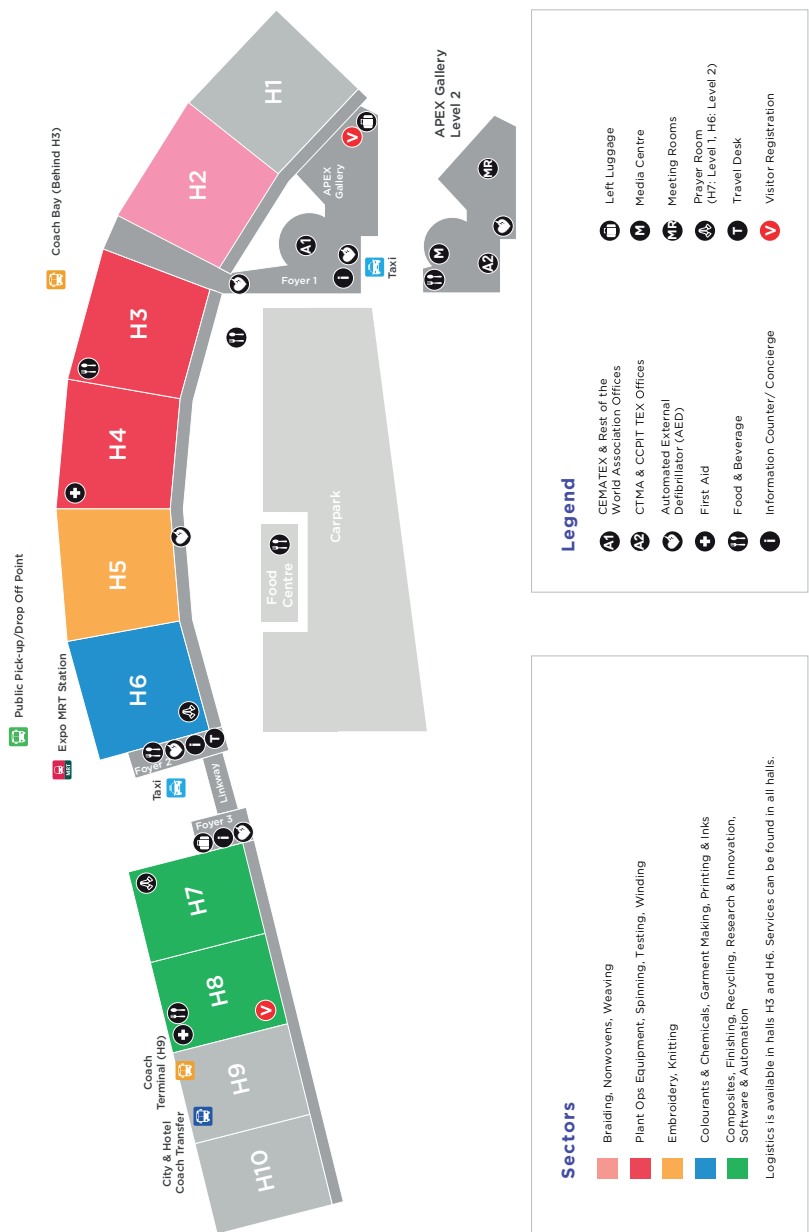
Italian textile machinery companies are placed in areas of ancient textile tradition, where an exchange of experience with end users offers a strong impetus to the constant technological upgrading of machinery. Textile clusters are located in Northern and Central Italy: Bergamo, Biella, Brescia, Como, Milan, Prato, Vicenza.

The main characteristics that distinguish Italian textile machinery sector are:

- **skilled workforce** that ensures a high quality of products;
- **the dimensions of Italian companies** that allow a quick response to the need of each customer;
- **the flexibility and versatility** ensure a customized production for satisfying the needs of each customer;
- **the high technological level** of the supply, due to the constant attention paid by Italian companies to the R&D activities and to innovative solutions.
